

Performance during November 2022

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **14** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (ii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **53** officials of 14 various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iii) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **2** officials of 2 Organizations.
- (iv) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **38** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (v) Commission processed **1388** complaints (including **170** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation report in **23** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vi) Intensive Examination of **13** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **Rs.31.29 lakhs** during **November, 2022**.
- (vii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **51** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **147** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (viii) **33** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment/extension as full/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

Important activities:

- (i) Central Vigilance Commission observed "Vigilance Awareness Week, 2022" from 31st October - 6th November, 2022 with active participation by all Ministries/Departments/Organizations etc. covered under the jurisdiction of the Commission. The theme for 2022 was chosen as '**Corruption Free India for a developed Nation**', highlighting the need for transparency and integrity in public administration and also emphasizing on the collective duty and responsibility of all citizens to fight corruption, for building a strong, ethical nation. For inculcating true spirit of participative vigilance, the Commission focused on different Preventive Vigilance cum internal housekeeping activities

to be taken up as focus areas by all the Ministries/Departments/Organisations which included the following:-

- a) Property Management;
 - b) Management of Assets;
 - c) Record Management;
 - d) Technological Initiatives comprising two parameters;
 - Website Maintenance & updation;
 - Identification of new areas for service delivery for customers / staff to be brought on online portal and initiation of steps for creating online platform;
 - e) Updation of guidelines/circulars/manuals wherever found necessary, and
 - f) Disposal of complaints outstanding as on 15/08/2022.
- (ii) During the Vigilance Awareness Week, various activities/programmes viz. integrity pledge by citizens including public servants, quiz/essay competition etc. were organized by organizations and also in the Commission. Active participation of students at various schools/colleges and gram sabhas was also ensured. In addition, Central Vigilance Commissioner and other officers of the Commission addressed employees of various organizations during the week. Action taken reports from more than 260 organisations have been received and is under compilation. More such reports are expected from the respective organisations.
